Fun Icebreakers for Virtual Groups/Teams

Trivia

Who doesn't like a little trivia? Create trivia questions based on popular tv shows, or just grab a deck of cards from Trivial Pursuit. Break people into teams and have them compete at the start of a meeting. The winning team can get a prize or just hold bragging rights until someone manages to dethrone them.

Coffee Break

Share your go-to morning drink and see the wide range of preferences.

Two Truths and a Lie

A classic icebreaker, have meeting attendees share two truths and one lie about themselves, and then have everyone try to guess which is the lie. This is a great way to get to know a little more about your fellow colleagues.

Happy Hour

Like a coffee break, but at the end of the day, have a little happy hour. Share with others what your favorite drink, beer or wine is overall, and what you may be enjoying at the moment (if applicable).

Doodles

Make it a doodle challenge! Have attendees use the Whiteboard to draw a doodle of their favorite activity, a pet, or favorite place. Others can try guessing, or the person can just share a bit about what they drew. You'll be surprised by how creative some people can be, just go ahead and doodle!.

Live Polling

Conduct a quick poll. It can be something related to the conference so far, or something simple or silly such as; What did you eat for breakfast that day? What color are your socks? What kind of footwear are you wearing? What is your most common distraction that you may be concerned about during a virtual meeting – a kid or pet showing up? Someone just walking past in the background? The phone ringing? Considering many of us work from home, this may be a little more fun!

Guess That Sound

Remember when radio stations would play a clip of an obscure sound and make listeners guess what the sound was? It could be a bag of chips opening or a sprinkler, or something even more obscure and specific. You can also create the sound yourself, just not visible in the screen. This can be done strictly for fun and guessing, or can be may into a contest.

Highs and Lows

Get the group to share a high and a low from the week, one good thing and one bad thing. This will help them focus on gratitude and bring up challenges that can maybe be solved by others present.

Would You Rather

Another classic, play a round of Would You Rather to get the creativity rolling and see where coworkers fall when asked to choose crazy predicaments. You can even make it a challenge to see which side has more votes.

To Binge or Not to Binge

It's an important question when there isn't much to do besides watch season after season of new television shows or movies. Have the group share their favorite new show or ask if a show is worth watching. Just remember, no spoilers!
